LOUIS WILSON (St Leonard's, Denton)


- (1) new families who have recently joined us to continue to stick with weekly church.

- (2) me to preach Jesus, not a product, and for my heart to be fuelled by my relationship with the Father, Son and Spirit.




- (1) the ongoing work of the ASPIRE building development project. Pray for progress with the necessary permissions and for further finance (big appeal in November 2014).
